Welcome to all new residents of Landkey. This newsletter is published and delivered bi-monthly. I hope you will all be using the facilities in the village, Shop/Post Office, Old School Centre, Village Hall, Pub and the Millennium Green.

#### SPRING FESTIVAL

This is now planned for March 19th at the Millennium Green and we hope that the whole village will take part. We are asking that local Groups and Organisations will be represented by having a stall or information point so they can publicise their activities and raise money. We hope that this event will lead to other future Community schemes, such as Tidy Landkey Campaign and will be an opportunity to bring the whole Community together. ## SPONSORED HAIR CUT - FLEUR

Fleur aged 12 is going to cut off 15" of her long hair for charity – again on 9th January. 2 years ago Fleur dontated 23 inches of her hair and over £100 to Little Princess Trust- a charity that provides real hair wigs for children who have lost their hair through illness or injury. She has been growing her hair ever since and is hoping to donate 15 inches, over twice the minimum length they need. Fleur will send her hair to Little Princess Trust again, but she also wants to raise money to buy a new minibus for Lampard Special School in Newport. Fleur is a pupil at the school where they use the mini bus to take children with a variety of special needs and disabilities on local trips. The bus needs replacing and although the Variety Club will help them, the school still needs to raise £12,000 for the bus. She was very touched to hear how difficult children find it when they loose their hair and how a wig helps them feel normal and positive again, Fleur understand how it feels to be different and wanted to do what she can to help. Please do support her if you can, maybe 10p per inch, say £1.50. Both are very deserving causes and Fleur is really keen to show that anyone can help others. If anyone wishes to donate to Fleur's collection or sponsor her, they could drop a donation into her Guides Unit in Landkey Village hall on Thursday evenings 6:30 to 8:30 pm, or give any donations or spare change to her collection tin which will be in at the village shop/post office from 9th January 2016.
